Cavallaro's game is to take the ball hard to the basket. Guarding the primary ball handler in the Indians' full-court press, the freshman guard had many uncontested looks after correctly anticipating passes.

"Fast breaking is something we try to do," said Cavallaro, who had nine of Venice's 22 steals.

"Beating a team three times is hard to do," Venice sophomore guard Juliana Cavallaro said. "We came out ready to play." The Indians opened a 22-point lead on a three-point play by Cavallaro midway through the second quarter.

"We wanted to pressure the ball, so we could play in transition," said Cavallaro of the Indians, who forced 37 turnovers. "Coach wanted us to pressure the ball, because we knew we have quicker guards."

Cavallaro led with 30 points, one of three Indians in double figures in scoring. "Really. It shocks me every time," Cavallaro said of her point total. "It felt like we are really coming together, playing as a team. We set each other up with great passes on offense."

The record night gave Cavallaro 69 points in Venice's two district wins.

### ***Venice girls rally past Riverview***

SARASOTA – With the Venice High girls basketball team establishing a rhythm for the first time in the game, Joe Whelton did not want to disrupt it. That meant leaving Juliana Cavallaro in after she picked up her fourth foul with 5:43 remaining in the fourth.

"She's smart enough to stay in the game," Whelton said. Not only did Cavallaro remain in the game, she got to the foul line. Cavallaro, who had all eight points in the third quarter, added five from the line in the final 3:30.

"I had to play smart and make sure I didn't get that fifth foul," said Cavallaro, who finished with 19 points, 16 in the second half. "We had to play better team defense. We had to talk more on defense and help each other out."

It took Cavallaro 1:20 to get the Indians even, scoring the final eight points of the third quarter.
